We are set to recommend grants to another group of charities at our **Vestry Meeting** on March 13<sup>th</sup>. I hope you can attend that meeting. All members of St. Bart's are members of Vestry. It is our annual gathering that reviews the past year and sets a new budget and priorities for the coming year. The meeting begins at 12:30 p.m., immediately following the service.

Our Bishop, **John Chapman**, visited us on January 16 as our preacher and celebrant at the Eucharist. On February 1st, I attended the 100<sup>th</sup> birthday of our most senior parishioner **Wynne Mundy**, who now lives at the Edinburgh Residence. ## New Class Coming to Growing Sunday School

Sunday School at St. Bart's is expanding. Since September 2009, the number of children participating in Sunday morning groups has increased from less than 20 to approximately 30 - an increase of more than 50 per cent. This happy situation has required teachers to add a third class designed especially for children aged six to eight, the school's largest age group.

The St. Bart's Sunday school is coordinated by Carole Schmidt, a former principal of the junior school at Rockcliffe's Elmwood School. Carole credits the increase in class size to the Sunday School's enthusiastic team of teachers and their commitment to engaging young people, particularly through the introduction of a new curriculum called "SPARK - Activate Faith." The SPARK program provides a greater variety of activities and lessons to fit the wide age range of the children and also allows teachers to tailor their classes. This year's teachers are Linda Assad-Butcher, Bryan Brulotte, Gillian Campbell, Carina DePellegrin, Blair Dickerson, Richard Maclure, Lisa Samson and Claire Burrows. We're looking forward to a very exciting year!

In other Christian education news, the Sunday School will be offering a pre-communion class beginning April 3. Please speak to the teachers for more information.

St. Bart's participation in the Cornerstone programme began in the fall of 2009 when parishioner Janet Uren arranged for part proceeds of a play to help fund a St. Bart's Cornerstone initiative. Enthusiasm for the project led other parishioners and team members to donate their time and funds as well. In the fall of 2010, Janet collaborated with the Linden House players to raise \$1500 in ticket sales and \$430 in dessert sales from a special performance of Noel Coward's play *Blithe Spirit*. The performance, attended by members of St. Bart's and the local community, was very well received - as were the funds raised! Once a month, parishioner Moira Esdaile leads a team of volunteers at the Rockcliffe Retirement Residence in preparing sandwiches and Moira provides her special shortbread for the Cornerstone evening meal.
