## The Church Calendar

~

Our calendar of Feasts, Memorials, and Commemorations is not a static document. By the mid 4th century there was a calendar for the commemoration of martyrs, but the root of our practice was drawn up by the Venerable Bede in the early 8th century. This list emphasized English martyrs and saints, establishing the importance of local relevance to the commemorations. During the medieval period the calendar became so cluttered that at the Reformation, Henry VIII order it cleaned up, including the removal of St Thomas of Canterbury whom he found quite unpalatable. When the first edition of the Prayer Book was published in 1549 the calendar marked only 24 feasts. The revision of the Prayer Book in 1552 had little change, but under Mary, the practice went back to the old style with almost every day celebrated. In 1561 a commission provided a list which was the basis of practice for the next 400 years. There were 76 days set apart for the Saints, including 21 for those especially connected to the Lord, 20 for the martyrs from the Age of Persecutions, 21 for English Saints, and 11 for teachers and the French, and 3 other festivals (All Saints, The Holy Innocents, and St. Michael and all Angels). These names were printed in the Prayer Book, but a few others, perhaps surprising omissions, like St Patrick and St Thomas were also included in separate calendars authorized by the Archbishop of Canterbury. Three new commemorations were adopted: the deliverance from the Gunpowder Plot, the martyrdom of Charles I, and the restoration of the church under Charles II. Our own calendar was seriously revised for the 1962 BCP, in which Anglicans, including Canadians, were inserted, and then again for the BAS, where the consideration was more ecumenical. 2012 marks the 50th anniversary of our own Prayer Book and the 350th anniversary of the BCP published in 1662, which was used when our church was founded. *Submitted by Chris Burn*
